THE MONOC TRACT

This property was acquired by Coastal Lumber Company from Prospect Land and Development Company by deed dated March 9, 1993, and recorded in Clay County in Deed Book 160 at Page 493, and in Nicholas County in Deed Book 351 at Page 747. It consists of several adjoining parcels containing a total of 5,978 deed acres, and 6,111 GIS acres. The tract is located southwest of Clay, West Virginia, on the watershed of Leatherwood Creek in both Clay County and Nicholas County.

The topography of the property is typical of this area of West Virginia. The elevation ranges from 780 feet to 1850 feet. Average slopes are 35% to 40%. Soil types are in the Gilpin series. The average annual precipitation ranges from 37 to 46 inches. The property has been subject to surface mining for coal by Lessees of the owners of the minerals. Approximately 1,777 acres have been surface mined, leaving a total of approximately 4,201 acres in productive timberland.

Forest Management Plans had been developed in conjunction with the surface mining of coal. Sawtimber and pulpwood were harvested in advance of the surface mining as mining permits were approved. The residual sawtimber stands were inventoried on a ten year rotation and timber harvesting was planned as the timber reached maturity.
